#### Trading Income

Trading income was in line with previous year

#### Consultancy Income

▶ End of programmes meant this revenue declined as predicted. There is a possibility of new programmes starting in 2022-23 but this has not been factored into business forecasts

#### Shop Trading Profit & Loss

Trading loss increased from previous year to £13,161. Key factors included increased wage costs and and a sales mix that reduced gross margins.

#### Other Income

No grants were applied for or received during the year, compared to the previous year when a £10,000 Covid support grant was received. However, the trading losses were partially offset by donations





### **Summary of Current Trading**



- April, May & June traded 5% down on the same months in 2021
- Sales in July, August & September have been 7.5% ahead of the same period last year, and in line with our stretch forecast
- Our gross profit has also improved in the last two months (to 24%)
- Customer numbers (measured by number of transactions) in first ½ of 2022/23 in line with same six months last year (700 transactions per week)
- Average basket spend marginally up on the year in first 6 months of 2022/23 (£6.03 versus £5.87)
- We believe recent upturn partly due to more visitors and more pickers using the shop
